From the Pastor-Poet's Pen



You are invited! After introducing the idea of being a "Just Peace" congregation in my message last month, several of you have expressed that you are interested to learn more. Therefore, I extend an invitation to prayer and explore with me. The Thirtieth General Synod called on the congregations of the United Church of Christ to mark the Sunday preceding

September 21 as "[Just Peace Sunday](#)". Each year, "Just Peace" congregations dedicate prayers or full Sunday services and coordinated actions to celebrate Just Peace work inside and outside the building walls, and renew their commitment. I have committed myself, and I ask you to join me in a summer of exploration. Consistory and I will be sharing with you opportunities for Bible Study, prayer, and learning about how we might grow, heal, and transform as a "Just Peace" congregation so that we can decide if we wish to officially enter the process with a "Just Peace Sunday" celebration.

Our witness as a Just Peace Church invites us to pray and learn and act around a variety of issues in order to bring about **God's Shalom** in the world. The World Council of Churches in 2011 issued a global [Ecumenical Call to Just Peace](#) that outlined the "way" of Just Peace. This document called on churches to build on the concepts of peace with the earth, peace in the

marketplace, peace in the community, and peace among all people. Grounded in UCC polity and covenantal theology, Just Peace is a call for UCC churches to address systemic injustice using non-violence, affirming with prophetic hope that "Peace is possible."



Every Sunday I spend laughing and loving and learning with the diverse and caring community that is Heidelberg, I feel honored to be part of a community willing to name and boldly proclaim a public

identity as a justice-doing, peace-seeking church. I would also like to know how we might do more of that work together and how we might take it outside of our building and into the world with confidence and conviction. I am excited to learn more and be inspired. I hope those of you who feel called will join me.

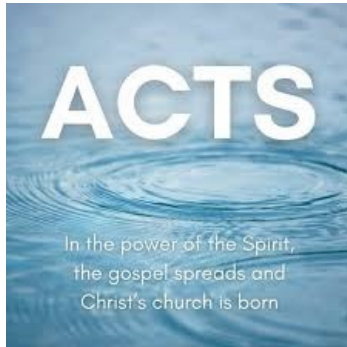

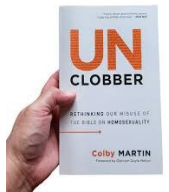

April Consistory Highlights

Your Consistory met on Monday, April 22 at 6:00 PM via Zoom. Highlights from that meeting include:

- ◆ Consistory reviewed the church calendar for May, June, and July in preparation for upcoming summer events.
- ◆ Susan Newcomer was nominated as one of HUCC's voting representatives to Cam's Ecclesiastical Council on May 5th, a second representative is still needed.
- ◆ Susan Newcomer was nominated as one of HUCC's voting representatives to the Annual Penn Central Conference Annual Meeting in State College, PA from June 7-9. A second representative is still needed.
- ◆ Personnel Committee reported that there were no new applications for the Associate Pastor position. However, the York Association informally



indicated that there were still multiple people interested.

- ◆ Alison, the Church Administrator, will be out on medical leave in early May. A discussion was had about how church leadership and church volunteers can assist with regular church operations.
 - ◆ Team of Teams is requesting volunteers for all York Pride related events in June. Heidelberg UCC is involved in multiple events throughout the month and volunteers are certainly needed.
 - ◆ A discussion was had regarding church security.
- ⇒ Karl Jacobs or Kelly McCaffery will be in charge of opening/closing the building Sundays in May.

An Introduction to "Just Peace"

For over 30 years, the Just Peace Church pronouncement has inspired a grassroots movement of UCC congregations committed to corporately naming and boldly proclaiming a public identity as a justice-doing, peace-seeking church. The Just Peace pronouncement affirmed the UCC as the first denomination to declare itself "Just Peace" and called on churches to go through an intentional discernment process to mirror that declaration.

Becoming a Just Peace church is of spiritual value to a congregation's Christian practice. To make a covenant that will

consider justice, peace and the sacredness of creation in all church's decisions and life is a big commitment that the Gospel calls us to. The World Council of Churches (WCC) through its "Ecumenical Call to Just Peace" has called on churches to work within four focus areas: the Environment, Economics, Global, and Local. Together with the global church, we are called to build: Just Peace with the Earth, Just Peace in the Marketplace, Just Peace among the Nations, and Just Peace in the Community. These jus-

tice concerns intersect with one another and with other issues of racial justice, LGBT justice, gender justice, disability justice, power and human and civil rights. The decision to become a Just Peace Church means we are ready to go

deeper in the work you have done and may also be an invitation to focus on a new area. It is not just recognition of work that has been done but the beginning of something new.



We have been invited in recent months to pray and learn more about our community and our place in the issues facing our neighborhood,

from homelessness to grief to election seasons and Interfaith relations. Your elected Consistory and I learned more about the "Just Peace" framework and felt it would support us in this journey. We will spend June using many of the Just Peace tools to begin our community conversations and invite you to learn more at www.ucc.org/just-peace. If this feels helpful, Heidelberg will begin its journey to become York County's first Just Peace church, and unite in new ways with the community we are a part of. To God be the glory!

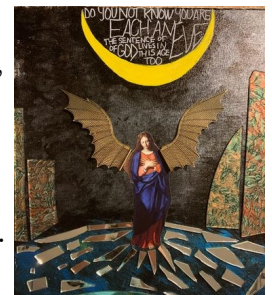

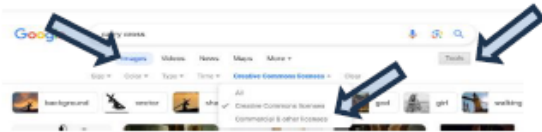

Images and Pictures – Part 2

Here are some free sources of images that don't necessarily need to be cited (although, it is a good habit to still cite them).

- <https://media.tithely.com/>
 - We use Tithely for online giving (there is no annual fee – you are only charged if people use it for giving, which our people generally do not.) They have a really wide selection of free images for churches. I recommend checking them out first since these images tend to follow a church theme.
- Free-to-use images on Google –
 - This one is a little trickier. Go to a Google search and type in your topic, then choose **Images**. To the right you'll see an option that says **Tools**. This opens yet another menu. This is a handy menu – you can choose the size of the search picture, the color, etc. What we are interested in here is the **Usage Rights** option. Click on it and choose **Creative Commons Licenses**. Many images will now disappear, but you should be left with images that you can use. Some will need to be cited.



- You can also use a Stock image site such as Pexels.com, Unsplash.com (this is what I tend to use when Tithely fails me) and Pixabay.com. Some of them also sell images. They do appreciate attribution.
- Part of the Wikipedia group, commons.wikimedia.org also contains images and videos. You will find paintings from the 1500s here as well as images from NASA. All of these images are in the public domain.
- Flickr is still around. Some of the images require attribution and some are for sale. I have found some lovely images of churches from around the world.
- A site that I have never used but found while researching this article, is the Library of Congress - <https://www.loc.gov/>. Again, these are more of the newsworthy type of images or are very old.
- Some museums have available images. For example – the Smithsonian, the National Gallery of Art, and the New York Public Library.
- The people who created the Creative Commons licensing have also created a site – openverse.org. This site is fairly new.

I would avoid using Pinterest for images unless you have the ORIGINAL owner's permission. The problem with Pinterest is that sometimes an image is reposted by so many people, it is hard to find the original owner.

Now you have sources that will help you find all of the royalty free, legal images you need!

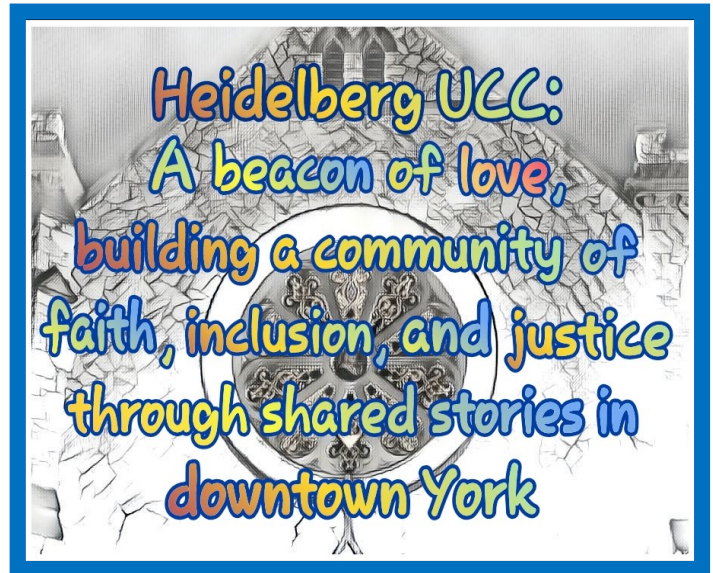
